ABOUT THE PUBLICATION SCHEME

Every public authority covered by the Freedom of Information Act has a legal duty to maintain a publication scheme.

The purpose of a publication scheme is to make information readily available to the public without the need for specific written requests. Schemes are intended to encourage authorities to proactively publish information, to develop a culture of openness and participation.

The publication scheme lists the information which is readily available to the public. The list is divided into seven (7) different categories of information, to help you find the documents you are looking for.

This publication scheme commits the Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce to making information available to the public as part of its normal business activities.

The Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce will:

- specify the information held by the authority, which falls within the seven (7) categories below;
- proactively publish or otherwise make routinely available, information which is held by the authority and falls within the categories below;
- describe the methods by which specific information is made available, so that it can be easily identified and accessed by members of the public;
- list any fees charged for access to information described in this scheme;
- publish or otherwise make information available, in accordance with the methods and fees stated in this scheme;
- · make this publication scheme available to the public; and
- regularly review and update the information made available under this scheme.

INFORMATION THAT MAY BE WITHHELD

The Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce will generally not publish:

- information in draft form;
- information that is not held by the Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce, or which has been disposed of in accordance with a legally authorised disposal schedule;
- information that is not readily available for example: information that is contained in files that have been placed in archive storage, or is otherwise difficult to access; and
- information that is exempt under the FOI Act, or otherwise protected from disclosure –
 for example: personal information; or commercially sensitive information. Records
 containing exempt matters will be published in a redacted form, wherever it is practical
 to do so, indicating which exemptions apply.

In maintaining this publication scheme, our aim is to be as open as possible.

However, there may be limited circumstances where information will be withheld from one of the categories of information listed in section 7: Categories of information.

Information will only be withheld where the FOI Act expressly permits it.

For example: where disclosure would breach the Act of confidentiality, infringe personal privacy, harm the Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce (or another organization's) commercial interests, or endanger the protection of the environment.

Whenever information is withheld, we will inform you of this and explain why that information cannot be released. Even where information is withheld, it may be possible to provide a redacted copy, with the exempt matter edited out.

• If you wish to complain about any information which has been withheld, please refer to Section 6: Complaints.

The Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce will endeavour to make as much information available on its website as possible, however, if you are seeking information that is not posted there, or if you would prefer to view the information in hard copy in person, arrangements can be made to do so by appointment in the privacy of our conference room.

FEES AND CHARGES

The purpose of this scheme is to make the maximum amount of information readily available at minimum effort and cost to the public.

Fees may be charged for providing information in paper copy or on computer disc. Charges will reflect the actual costs of reproduction and postage, as described below.

Reproduction costs

Where fees apply, photocopied information will be charged at a standard rate of CI\$1.00 per page (black and white; any size) and CI\$1.50 per page (colour; any size). Computer discs will be charged at a rate of CI\$2.00 per disc.

Postage costs

The Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce will pass on to the requester the actual costs of postage or courier delivery.

Details of any individual charges which differ from the above policy are provided within Section 7: Categories of information.

If a fee applies, you will be advised of the amount and how it has been calculated. Information will be provided when the Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce has received your payment.

FOI Responsibilities

There are five departments under the Ministry's remit in addition to a number of boards, committees and councils. The General Registry, the Department of Commerce and Investment and the Department for International Tax Cooperation) handle their own FOI requests and the Ministry deals with internal reviews of these agencies in the event that an applicant is dissatisfied with the response received. FOI responsibilities for the Cayman Islands Intellectual Property Office and the National Maritime Secretariat are handled by the Ministry. Ministry Overview

The remit of the Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce is broad, covering the financial services sector including local commerce as well as the aviation and maritime industries.

The Ministry develops commercial and regulatory policy and legislation in these areas as well as provide a number of services in support of these industries. To accomplish this, there are four core entities in the Ministry that develop high-level policy, legislation, and processes, and provide administrative support, to meet the Ministry's goals; and the Ministry's five operational entities, which put these policies and legislation into action.

The core and operational entities are equally important, and interdependent. The Ministry also oversees five Statutory Authorities and Government Companies (SAGCs), which are semi-autonomous bodies, with the Cayman Islands Government as the sole shareholder.

Core Ministry

Policy and Communications Unit (PCU): Provides Government with policy advice; legislative development; and strategic, operational and administrative communications and public affairs. The unit is the main channel for financial services industry relations, typically conducted through consultation; and for relations with key financial services stakeholders including global regulatory bodies, elected officials and high-ranking department staff in foreign governments; media, and the local public.

Trade and Commerce (TCU): Supports the work of the Maritime Authority and the Civil Aviation Authority and provides Government with policy advice and legislative development relative to the maritime and aviation sectors, and for domestic commerce.

Regulatory Affairs Unit (RAU): Provides strategic guidance and IT support to the Ministry's operational agencies (General Registry, the Department of Commerce and Investment, and the Department for International Tax Cooperation), as they implement policy and legislation developed by the PCU and CMU units, and as approved by Government.

Operations and Administration Unit (OAU): Ensures that the Ministry and its agencies comply with Government policies, legislation, processes and best practices for Human Resources, Records and Information Management, Financial Management and Administration, in support of the Ministry's strategic and operational goals.

Departments

A summary of each department's role in the ministry and activities is provided below.

General Registry

The role of General Registry is to facilitate registration of financial structures and vital events in compliance with the relevant Acts, policies and procedures. The scope of activities includes:

- Registration of varying forms of financial structures and vital events according with relevant legislation and policies.
- Identification of initiatives to enhance the services offered to the financial services sector and the wider community.
- Provision of information recorded on the registers according to established policy and legislation.

- Registration of varying forms of financial structures and vital events according with relevant legislation and policies.

- Provision of information recorded on the registers according to established policy and legislation.
- Participation in the development of policies and legislations relative to the registers managed and maintained by the department.

- Maintenance of a centralized platform for beneficial ownership information.

Department for International Tax Cooperation

Department for International Tax Cooperation is responsible for Cayman's compliance with international obligations in tax matters and information exchanges with countries overseas. It also works to improve and support local and international compliance with international tax standards via active participation, and representation on behalf of Cayman's government, in discussions at the global regulatory level.

Department for Commerce and Investment

The Department for Commerce and Investments provides business licensing services to specified sectors, ensuring compliance of licensed businesses with local commerce legislation and local and international standards. This includes administration and issuance of Trade & Business Licenses, Local Company (Control) Licenses, Tobacco Permits, Liquor Licenses, Public Film Exhibition Premises Licenses and Special Economic Zone Company Licenses. These services, in conjunction with the regulatory and enforcement activities that the Department of Commerce and Investment undertakes, are critical to ensure that there is a robust framework to support the growth and success of the local business environment.

The Cayman Islands Intellectual Property Office

The Cayman Islands Intellectual Property Office is a unit under the Ministry of Financial Services and Commerce (MFSC) responsible for the administration of all intellectual property rights. The CIIPO provides registration services for trade marks, patents and designs. The CIIPO is also responsible for licensing the use of orphan works under its Copyright Orphan Licensing scheme and licensing persons to act as registered agents.

National Maritime Affairs Secretariat

National Maritime Affairs Secretariat provides strategic level oversight, coordination, monitoring and support to all stakeholders contributing to the ongoing delivery of the National Maritime Strategy, to ensure compliance with all relevant international conventions related to Maritime Administration involving Port, Coastal and Flag State activities. NMAS also identifies potential benefits to enable the holistic development of the Cayman Islands' maritime sector.

Statutory Authorities and Government Companies (SAGCS)

SAGCs are semi-autonomous bodies, with the Cayman Islands Government as the sole shareholder. Each has its own governing body (generally a board of directors), which is appointed by Cabinet.

The duties and powers of statutory authorities and government companies are set out in Part V of Public Management and Finance Act, but also the Public Authorities Act. Each statutory authority is established under its own enabling legislation, which establishes the details of its governance. Government companies are created under the Cayman Islands Companies Act and its governance is set out in its Memorandum and Articles of Association required by the act.

Cayman Islands Monetary Authority (CIMA): CIMA is one of Cayman's financial services industry regulators and supervisors, with oversight for banking and related services; fiduciary services; insurance companies; investment funds and fund administrators; securities investment businesses; persons to serve as directors, officers and managers of licensed entities; and auditors of regulated entities. It assists overseas regulatory authorities, including by executing memoranda of understanding to assist with consolidated supervision; and advises Government, through the Ministry, on monetary, regulatory and cooperative matters.

Cayman Islands Stock Exchange (CSX): CSX is a leading, globally focused, specialist exchange that is a gateway to global markets. It lists corporate debt securities, specialist debt securities, retail debt securities, equity securities, derivative warrants, investment funds, depositary receipts, and secondary listings.

Auditors Oversight Authority (AOA): AOA regulates and supervises auditors of markettraded companies. The AOA is completely independent of the accounting and auditing profession.

Maritime Authority of the Cayman Islands (MACI): MACI functions as the maritime administration of the Cayman Islands and as such discharges, on behalf of the CIG, the range of responsibilities and services normally associated with such a maritime administration, in serving the global shipping community. It is also responsible to the UK Secretary of State via the UK's Department of Transport to ensure effective implementation of relevant international maritime and related conventions that have been ratified by the UK Government and extended to the Cayman Islands.

Civil Aviation Authority of the Cayman Islands (CAACI): CAACI's role is safety oversight and economic regulation of Cayman's aviation industry, by ensuring compliance with the standards and best practices required by the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO).
