GUIDELINES FOR CLEAN-UP

Roadside and Beach Litter Collection Tips

1. **Wear a hat, sunscreen and start early.**
2. **Wear gloves, good sturdy shoes, thick socks and long pants.** Wear old clothing because of the presence of Tar.
3. **Use caution** when handling sharp objects and large debris. Do not lift heavy objects like logs and large debris. Leave driftwood and other natural items on the beach.
4. **Be cautious**, try not to trample plants that grow by the sea in the grassy areas.
5. **Avoid any kind of deceased or injured animal**, which may be infected or dangerous. If it is still alive call the Humane Society (domestic animals) or the National Trust (wild animals). Call the Department of Environmental Health at 949-6696 for the removal of any deceased animal.
6. **Avoid any drums and unidentified containers**, which may contain hazardous chemicals. Note the location of these containers and immediately contact the Department of Environmental Health at 949-6696. *Even opening these containers to inspect the contents can result in serious injury!*
7. **Place bags of garbage on the side of the road** so they are highly visible to Department of Environmental Health Staff. Be careful not to obstruct traffic.
8. **Use caution when on the roadside** and stay alert. Wear bright coloured clothing.
9. **Do not touch any medical waste** such as syringes. Note the location of these items and immediately contact the Department of Environmental Health at 949-6696.
10. **Avoid removing any lead-acid batteries** (car/boat batteries). *The acid contained in these batteries is extremely corrosive and may cause permanent eye and skin damage.* Note the location of these batteries and contact the Department of Environmental Health at 949-6696.
11. **Use the transparent bags for the collection of aluminium cans.** These bags will be collected separately and taken to the Landfill for recycling.
