Health Practice Act (2026 Revision) and Health Practice Regulations (2021 Revision)

Application Guidelines for Registration and Practicing Licence for Pharmacy Technicians

- A. An applicant shall be eligible for registration where he / she is fully registered as a health practitioner in:
- a) Australia;
 - b) Canada;
 - c) Jamaica;
 - d) New Zealand;
 - e) South Africa;
 - f) the United Kingdom; or
 - g) the United States of America;
- Or
- i. has completed the pharmacy technician courses in one of these 7 countries that is recognized by the Pharmacy Council or other professional or education bodies as accredited **plus** having worked 2 years in a pharmacy in a dispensary as a pharmacy assistant or technician or pharmacist at the Pharmacy Council's discretion.
- Or
- ii. has worked as a pharmacy technician for 10 years or more in one of the 7 countries listed in (i) and or the Cayman Islands and providing a detailed outline of work experience, training, job descriptions and pharmacist references for entire pharmacy career and the council will consider each application on an individual basis
- Or
- iii. is licensed as a pharmacist in any country and providing such details of education and work experience at the Pharmacy Council's discretion.
- iv. provides evidence that he/she is eligible for full registration in any of the countries listed in (i);
- B. Specialty pharmacy technicians will be standardized based on their specialty (i.e, IV admixtures, Chemo) and will qualify through any one of (i), (iii), or (iv) above.
- i. Those who apply for registration as a specialist pharmacy technician shall provide written evidence that they have obtained the necessary qualification and completed at least one year experience in their area of specialty;
 - ii. Specialty pharmacy technicians must also complete continuing education credit requirements annually as set forth by the country from which they obtained training and experience.
