

No Need for Speed

Everyone wants to get where they're going - but rushing or racing puts lives at risk. Speed limits aren't about slowing you down; they're about keeping everyone safe.

The Risk

Between 2022 and 2024, more than **10,000 speeding tickets** were issued in Cayman. In 2024 alone, **over 1,500** drivers were caught going faster than 50 mph. Speeding might feel harmless in the moment — when you're late, frustrated, or chasing the thrill — but every extra mile per hour cuts your reaction time. Those lost milliseconds can be the difference between stopping safely... and hitting someone who never had a chance.

Stick to the limit - especially in school zones, roundabouts, and neighbourhoods. Plan a few extra minutes so you're not tempted to rush.



Stay alert - higher speeds mean less time to see and react. Adjust your speed for weather and road conditions.



Respect the law - fines, licence loss, and even prison are real consequences.

Quick Reminders



The faster you go, the less time you have to react. Being late is better than never arriving. Speeding doesn't save time - it risks lives.

Every driver plays a part in keeping Cayman's roads safe. Smart follows the speed limit. Reckless puts lives at risk.

Remember the Road Code

Speed limits are not a target.

It's often neither appropriate nor safe to drive at the maximum limit. Never exceed the prescribed limit - and don't drive so slowly that you obstruct traffic.
